No exhibitor may show more than one entry for any one number.

Those people exhibiting a total of five (5) or LESS items and/or vegetables (animals excluded) in Department 7 and 8 may purchase a Mini-Exhibitor Ticket for \$15.00. This ticket will also admit exhibitor to the Fair on two occasions. Exhibitors entering more than five (5) entries in those two (2) Departments will be required to purchase a 2007 Exhibitor's Ticket OR a 2007 Membership ticket from the Greene County Agricultural Society for \$25.00. This \$25.00 ticket permits holder to exhibit an unlimited number of items in ANY department of Greene County Fair and gives the holder admission to the Fair each day.

All 4-H & FFA members who enter this dept. (2nd or 7th Dept.) must pay an entry fee of \$10.

Goods must be in place by 12 noon on Sunday, July 29, 2007. Judging will take place on Sunday afternoon at 2:00 p.m.

NOTE: Articles will be released on Saturday, August 4th from 9:00 p.m.-10:00 p.m. and Sunday, August 5th from 10:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m. Greene County Agricultural Society is NOT responsible for articles or ribbons left after 2:00 p.m. on Sunday.

NOTE: Fruits, vegetables, pickles and relishes to be canned in either regulation quart or pint jars; jams and jellies MUST be in half pint or jelly jars. The judge may open and inspect any jar on display.

FLORICULTURE

General rules and regulations for junior and senior division

Junior Division age 8 to 15 (as of January 1st)

Senior Division age 15 and up

1. Any person to compete for class premiums must have an Exhibitor Ticket. An Exhibitor Ticket, which is \$30.00 must be purchased by anyone who exhibits unless he or she holds a 2007 membership ticket or has a 4-H or FFA 2007 wristband in the Greene County Agricultural Society.

Those people exhibiting a total of five (5) or less items and/or vegetables/floriculture (animals excluded) in department 7 and 8 may purchase a mini-exhibitor ticket for \$15.00. This ticket will also admit exhibitor to the fair on two (2) occasions. Exhibitors entering more than five (5) entries in those two (2) departments will be required to purchase a 2007 exhibitor's ticket or a 2007 membership ticket from the Greene County Agricultural Society for \$25.00. This \$25.00 ticket permits holder to exhibit an unlimited number of items in any department of Greene County Fair and gives the holder admission to the fair each day.

2. Entries are open to all residents of Greene County and adjoining counties unless otherwise stated.

3. All arrangements/potted plants must be planted/arranged by the exhibitor.

4. Horticultural specimen exhibits must have been planted and grown by exhibitors for period of 3 months.

5. Potted plants must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least three months and must be in a watertight container or have a saucer beneath and labeled as to named variety. Pot shall not exceed 18" in diameter. Any larger will be disqualified by chairmen in charge.

6. Containers will be furnished by the exhibitor and should have the exhibitor's name and address on the bottom.

7. Bases, mats, figurines and accessories may not be used in all classes unless specified. No artificial foliage, flowers, fruits, etc. may be used.

8. Painted or artificially-colored fresh plant material is never permitted.

9. Exhibitors are urged to use adequate plant materials so that the exhibit has good horticultural value.

10. In all classes, evidence of dirt, dust or spray residue should be washed off, all dead leaves and bugs removed and plants or flowers well groomed before they are brought in.

11. Horticulture exhibits must be correctly identified and labeled as to the named variety. Correct scientific names with correct variety name if known should be attached to the entry tag of each exhibit. Cards will be provided by the committee upon submission of entry blank.

12. All plant material used in artistic design classes must be listed on a special card provided by the committee upon submission of entry blank.

13. Members of garden clubs will exhibit as individuals unless designated otherwise. No commercial business entries permitted.

14. An exhibitor may make only one entry in each artistic design class.

15. An exhibitor may make as many entries a desired in a horticulture specimen class, provided each entry is a different variety or cultivar.

16. No exhibit may compete in more than one class.

17. Exhibits not meeting the specifications of the schedule will be disqualified by chairmen in charge.

18. In order to insure an adequate number of entries in each class, the committee reserves the right to combine, add, withdraw or subdivide a class as needed. Additional classes will be set up if entries warrant.

Entries for all classes in the senior and junior artistic design classes must be mailed or submitted by July 20, 2007.

20. 1st and 2nd place ribbons and premiums along with best of show awards will be given in the senior artistic design and potted plant classes.

21. 1st and 2nd place ribbons only will be given in the junior artistic design class and potted plant classes.

22. The Fair Board will do everything possible to see that the exhibits are properly protected, but can assume no obligation for loss or damage.

SENIOR DIVISION (AGE 15 AND UP)

Items may be brought in between 3 PM and 5 PM and all potted plants and artistic design must be in place by 5 PM on July 30, 2007, and cannot be removed before 8 PM on Aug. 4, 2007.

The senior division show will be judged on July 30, 2007 by OAGC accredited judges and appropriate named judges. Judging will be by the standard system.

The exhibit hall, floriculture area will be cleared by 5 PM, and all exhibitors who have not entered by then will not be permitted to exhibit.

The Junior Division Show will be judged on August 1, 2007 by OAGC accredited judges or appropriate named judges. Judging will be by the standard system.

Plants must be owned and grown by the exhibitor for at least three months. The exhibitor must furnish all plant names. No oil or polishing permitted on foliage.
