## RULES

**NOTE: Mercantile Building will close at 10:00 p.m. each evening unless otherwise posted.**

- Ages 9 and under (as of January 1st):** There will be a \$10.00 entry fee. This fee does not include a ticket to enter the fair because children 9 and under enter the fair free with paying adult.
- Ages 10-17 (as of January 1st):** There are three options:
  - 4-H/FFA who wishes to enter may do so for \$10.00.
  - Pay \$15.00 and exhibit up to 10 items and receive a mini exhibitor ticket which allows entrance to the fair for three (3) days.
  - Pay \$25.00 and exhibit as many items as you wish in any department and receive an exhibitor ticket which will allow you to enter the fair every day for 7 days.
- This Department is open to residents of Greene and surrounding counties.
- All articles in this department **MUST** be in the **MERCANTILE BUILDING** on Thursday, July 28 between the hours of 9:00a.m. and 8:00p.m. except for baking (see that class).
- Each painting, drawing and/or photograph must be properly wired, framed and/or matted for hanging. If work is matted, mat board should NOT exceed 3-inches beyond edge of print. Art including frame, should be no more than 16"X20". No number painting. No nudes. Attach entry tags at upper right corner. Not responsible if picture falls due to improper hanging.
- Entries may be made in as many classes as desired, but only ONE entry per exhibitor in each book entry number.
- All entry tags must be attached securely to each entry.
- This department reserves the right to reject any article soiled, stained or because of size and/or content.
- The Fair Board will do everything possible to see that articles are properly protected, but can assume no obligation for loss or damage. At the discretion of the building superintendents and/or judges, they may dispose any item not worthy to keep.
- This department will be divided into three (3) groups: Pre-juniors (7 yrs and under), Juniors (8 yrs -12 yrs), and Teenagers (13 yrs-17 yrs) in all classes. Ages are as of January 1st.

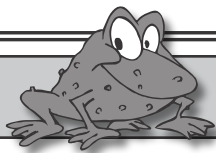

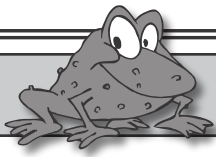

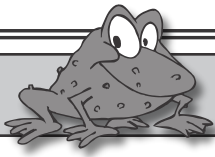

Those persons exhibiting a total of five (5) or less items and/or vegetables (animals excluded) may purchase a Mini-Exhibitor Ticket for \$15.00. This ticket will also admit exhibitor to the fair on three (3) occasions. Exhibitors entering more than five (5) entries will be required to purchase a 2011 Exhibitor's Ticket OR a 2011 Membership in the Greene County Agricultural Society at a cost of \$25.00. A fee of \$10.00 must be paid by 4-H or FFA members entering this department. A 2011 Membership Ticket or 4-H/FFA Pass allows ticket holder to exhibit an unlimited number of items in ANY department of the Greene County Fair and gives the holder admission to the fair each day.
2. **This department is open to residents of Greene as well as all surrounding counties.**
3. All articles in this department must be in the MERCANTILE BUILDING ON THURSDAY, JULY 28 between the hours of 9:00 a.m.-8:00 p.m. except for baking. (see that class)
4. Entries may be made in as many classes as desired, but only ONE entry per exhibitor in each book entry
5. This department reserves the right to reject any article soiled, stained or because of size and/or content.
6. Where articles are of inferior quality, the judges shall refuse to award premiums even though there is no competition, and in any case where articles are not deemed worthy of first premium, judges shall not award higher than second premium. All entries must be in the proper location for judging by 10:00 am, Tuesday, August 2 wrapped in plastic wrap. One wedge of cake and pie from each exhibit will be left on display until Wednesday night. Prizes will be awarded at 5:00 P.M. on Tuesday evening. Cakes and pies may be picked up after 5:15 p.m. on Tuesday evening.

#### CHOCOLATE LARD CAKE

- ½ cup lard
- 2 tablespoons milk
- 2 cups sifted cake flour
- 2/3 cup cocoa
- 1 1/3 cups sugar
- 1 teaspoon baking powder
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ½ teaspoon baking soda
- 1 cup thick sour milk
- 2 eggs

Whip the lard and 2 tablespoons milk together until light and fluffy. Add sifted dry ingredients to lard with 2/3 of the sour milk (to make sweet milk sour, subtract 1 tablespoon milk and add 1 tablespoon vinegar.) Beat until smooth. Blend in eggs and remaining milk. Beat 1 minute. Pour into 2 greased and floured 8" layer pans. Bake at 350°, 25-30 minutes. Cool on rack 10 minutes, then remove from pans. Frost with favorite icing.

#### APPLE PIE

##### Pie Crust

- 3 cups sifted flour
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup lard
- 6 tablespoons cold water

Mix flour salt and lard until mixture is crumbly. Add water a little at a time, blending lightly. Dough should be moist enough to cling together. It should not be sticky. Shape dough in smooth ball with hands and roll. Toll out bottom crust, fold dough in half and fit into lightly floured pie plate. Roll out top crust same as the bottom.

##### Filling for Apple Pie

- 6 cups thinly sliced peeled apples (a cooling apple)
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 tablespoon cornstarch
- ½ teaspoon nutmeg
- ½ teaspoon cinnamon
- 1 or 2 tablespoons butter

Mix dry ingredients lightly with apples in bowl. Put filling in unbaked pie crust. Dot with butter. Top with second crust. Brush with milk. Bake in oven at 400 degrees for 45-60 minutes or until apples are done.
